Today’s Affirmation of Faith is an excerpt from *The Confession of 1967*, which was the first new confession to be written since *The Westminster Confession of Faith* three centuries earlier. The turbulent decade of the 1960s called for the writing of a new statement of faith, using contemporary language and addressing contemporary crises such as the need for justice and reconciliation. The version of *The Confession of 1967* used today has been adapted further with the use of inclusive language, which would not be used in *The Book of Confessions* until the writing of *The Brief Statement of Faith* in the 1980s.

New Sermon Series on the Book of James Begins Today

One of the biggest complaints about the church is that Christians don’t always “walk their talk.” What Christians say they believe isn’t always demonstrated in their actions—judgment is more predominant than mercy and grace, hate more visible than love, and indifference and apathy more prevalent than sacrifice.

As Christians, we ourselves demonstrate that we don’t really believe what we say we believe. When times are difficult, our actions reveal that we’d rather take our lives into our own hands than trust the God we profess to be generous. When our faith is tested, our doubts make us vulnerable to the allure of self-sufficiency and material security, and our neighbor becomes our competitor rather than the one we’re called to love.

Yet, the Book of James says that God “gives to all generously and ungrudgingly.” When we learn to see the world through the lens of God’s abundance and really trust in God’s generosity toward all, we are set free to risk living what we say we believe. Belief and action come into alignment, like interlocking gears smoothly working together, and there is inward and outward integrity. Beginning this Sunday, join us as we learn life lessons about integrity from the Book of James. Next up:

- August 19: “Hearing and Doing with Integrity” (James 1:19-27)
- August 26: “Impartial Integrity” (James 2:1-13)
- September 2: “Working Integrity” (James 2:14-26)
- September 9: “Speaking with Integrity” (James 3:1-13)


