Looking Ahead: "This Chair Rocks"

There is an incessant barrage of messages from every corner that consigns the "no longer young" to the margins of society. Older adults internalize these and other messages and can contribute to their own disenfranchisement. One form of discrimination that we are often less aware of is ageism. Join Peg Lewis at 9:30 AM on Sunday mornings, January 27 and February 3, as we explore what ageism is and what its impact is on people of all ages. The conversation will be based on the book *This Chair Rocks* by Ashton Applewhite, but class participants do not need to purchase or read the book. 
