Next Sunday's Class: "From Pancakes to Ashes"

What's that dirt on your forehead? And why are you telling me I'm returning to dust? Join Pastor Kim at 9:30 AM next Sunday, March 3, for an exploration of what Ash Wednesday is. We will look at its scriptural basis, its meaning in theological perspective, and its application in personal spirituality and practice, deepening our understanding of our dependence on God in both life and death.

Lenten Class: "Vincent Van Gogh: Theologian with a Brush"

Beginning March 10 (two Sundays from today), adults and youth are invited to participate in a five-week Sunday morning class at 9:30 AM during Lent. Charles Davidson will lead us in an experiential encounter with Vincent van Gogh as we examine together the profoundly theological and spiritual dimensions of his life and art. A retired Presbyterian pastor and pastoral counselor, Charles was the Darrel Rollins Professor of Pastoral Theology, Care, and Counseling at Virginia University of Lynchburg. 
