The Justice & Reconciliation committee encourages all congregants to see Bryan Stevenson, attorney, activist, and best-selling author of *Just Mercy: A Story of Justice and Redemption*, speak at UNC Asheville's Kimmel Arena on Thursday, April 25. Doors will open at 6 PM, and the event will begin at 7 PM. The talk is free and open to everyone. Stevenson is the founder and executive director of the Equal Justice Initiative (EJI)—a non-profit law firm whose work for their clients has eliminated unfair sentencing, exonerated innocent death row prisoners, confronted abuse of the incarcerated and the mentally ill, and aided children prosecuted as adults. 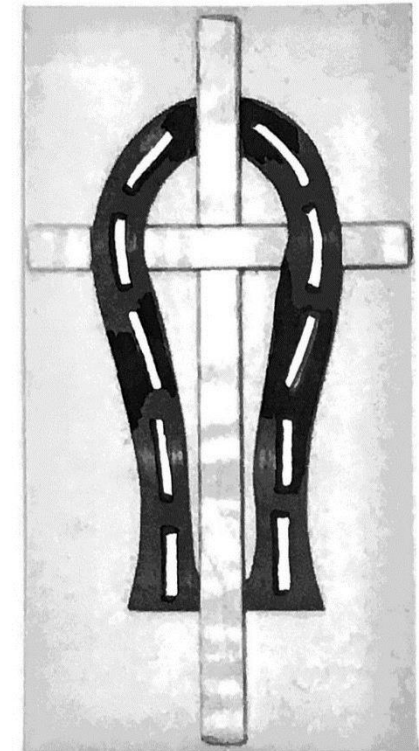

When Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him,
