ADVENT CANDLE PROCESSIONAL

The second Advent candle is processed into the sanctuary while the first and second verses of hymn 85 are sung by two soloists:

Soloist: Light one candle to watch for Messiah:
let the light banish darkness.
He shall bring salvation to Israel,
God fulfills the promise.

Soloist: Light two candles to watch for Messiah:
let the light banish darkness.
He shall feed the flock like a shepherd,
gently lead them homeward.

Deep Blue for Advent

Why are we using blue instead of purple for Advent this year? Deep blue is the color of the clear, predawn sky—the color that covers us in the dark, cold hours before the sun rises. Thus, many churches use blue for Advent as a sign of our hope-filled anticipation of the promised light of Christ breaking over the horizon at the dawn of a new day.

Alternative Christmas Giving

The Outreach Ministry encourages you to consider giving alternative gifts during this Advent season. We are sponsoring the following three agencies on the local, national, and international levels: (1) Local: ABCCM Medical Ministry provides families in need with urgent care, medication assistance, and dental care; (2) National: Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is the emergency and refugee program of the PCUSA; and (3) International: Scholarships for Guatemalan

You are invited to make a minimum donation of \$10 to receive an “honor card” to send to a friend or loved one for Christmas, telling them that you have made a donation to one of the above three organizations in their honor.
