### Called to Community: Sermon Series on 1 Corinthians 1-3

What kind of community does God call us to be as the Body of Christ? Writing to the faction-fraught church in Corinth, the apostle Paul lays out a rich and sweeping vision of a community that is called and held together by Christ. Join us as we explore some of the essential qualities that Christian communities are called to cultivate:

### New Sunday Morning Class: African American Theologians Speak

Beginning next Sunday, join Russ Moxley and Kim Wells for an exploration of our Christian call to reconciliation by spending the next several Sundays listening to African American theologians share their perspectives on the Christian life. We will begin next Sunday, January 26, simply by exploring the biblical call to reconciliation and by considering its implications for our lives. Then, for the four Sundays of February (Black History Month), we will listen to the voices of African American men and women, such as the Rev. Howard Thurman, the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and the Rev. Shawn Copeland. Though the course will conclude on February 26, our call to reconciliation continues. To that end, in conjunction with the Justice and Reconciliation Committee, we will be offering activities in the months to come such as a visit to the Shiloh neighborhood, a group outing to see the movie "Just Mercy," a possible trip to the Civil Rights Museum in Birmingham, and the exploration of shared activities with a local African American church.
