What kind of community does God call us to be as the Body of Christ? Writing to the faction-fraught church in Corinth, the apostle Paul lays out a rich and sweeping vision of a community that is called and held together by Christ. We began today, January 26, by exploring the biblical call to reconciliation and by considering its implications for our lives. Starting next Sunday, for the four Sundays of February (Black History Month), we will listen to the voices of African American men and women, such as Howard Thurman, Martin Luther King, Jr., James Cone, and M. Shawn Copeland. Though the course will conclude on February 23, our call to reconciliation continues. To that end, in conjunction with the Justice and Reconciliation Committee, we will be offering activities in the months to come such as a visit to the Shiloh neighborhood, a group outing to see the movie "Just Mercy," a possible trip to the Civil Rights Museum in Birmingham, and the exploration of shared activities with a local African American church.
